Medicare open enrollment has begun!! Staring October 15, 2019 you have the opportunity to review your Medicare plan for 2020. This is a great time to do some research to ensure your plan meets all of your medical and prescription drug needs as well as review pricing. There is a second enrollment period that begins January 1<sup>st</sup> and ends March 31, 2020. This time period allows the individual to make limited

changes if needed. For instance switching from one Medicare Advantage Plan to another or dis-enrolling from an Advantage Plan back to Original Medicare.
