### From the Kitchen

Nerve Cookies (also known as Intelligence Cookies) recipe courtesy of Virginia Butterworth

These cookies are helpful to sooth the nerves and slow the aging process. They also stimulate intelligence and create a cheerful heart. They have been known to be beneficial to distracted school children.

1 1/2 cups of butter
3 cups of brown sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
2 eggs- well beaten
4 teaspoons of baking powder
6 cups of flower
2 1/2 teaspoons of cinnamon
2 1/4 teaspoon of nutmeg
1/2 teaspoon of cloves
1 cup of ground or chopped almonds
(optional)

- Cream the butter and sugar until light and fluffy
- Add the eggs
- Combines and sift the dry ingredients then add them to the creamed mixture
- Knead on a flowered surface, briefly.
- Divide the dough and shape into log shaped rolls
- Wrap dough rolls into wax paper and thoroughly chill
- They can also be frozen for baking later
- Once rolls are firm, cut into thin slices
- Bake for 8 10 minutes at 375

Eat three to five cookies a day

#### **MEET YOUR NEIGHBOR**

This month features Arthur Plymesser

Thank you, Virginia Butterworth, for your contribution interviewing and writing about our residents.



Coming to John Clarke in 2013, **Arthur Plymesser** is our 6th longest standing resident. He was born in Fall River in 1925 but shortly became an Islander when his family moved to Newport.

A member of the "Greatest Generation" Arthur and four of his five brothers served in WW II and, mercifully, all returned home. Art served as an army cook, first in Europe and then Japan and Korea when he re-upped for another 3 years; he was honorably discharged in 1948.

In Japan in 1946, he saw firsthand the devastation of the atomic bomb attacks on Hiroshima and Nagasaki. Pre-Covid, Arthur was escorted on an Honor Flight to Washington DC to view the WW II memorial. When Arthur's army days ended, he returned to Rhode Island and joined his father as a baker in the family-owned Park Holm Bakery in Portsmouth. In 1949 he found his bride and wife of 42 years, Elsie Perry. They became the unexpected parents of their only son Stuart after 24 years of marriage. In 1953, Arthur left the 2 AM start days of a baker for more reasonable hours in newspaper production, first as a compositor for the Newport Daily News and later as foreman of the compositing room at the Taunton Daily Gazette until his retirement in 1990.

Arthur lost his wife Elsie the following year but was blessed again in a second marriage to the widowed Rachel Perry who had raised 5 children. Rachel eventually became a resident at the John Clarke Nursing Center which led to Arthur's move to the Retirement Center. The marriage brought to Arthur and our community Rachel's daughter, Sherry Fortin, our most dedicated and celebrated volunteer. As Arthur observed "I wouldn't know what to do without her." Arthur is an American Baptist and volunteered at the United Baptist Church on Spring Street for 35 years including cooking for the soup kitchen for 28 of those years. His other interest was fishing with his father off the rocks at Ledge Road and from his skiff. Arthur thinks John Clarke "is great" and feels life has been good to him. Wish him a happy 98th Birthday on June 28!
